

TAAN wraps up earthquake relief project

Trekking Agencies' Association of Nepal (TAAN) has wrapped up its earthquake relief project initiated in partnership with United Nations World Food Program (WFP).

A team of TAAN distributed final payment of the project to around 2,700 workers who

carried corrugated zinc sheets to the earthquake-hit families of Lapa in Dhading district. They carried the corrugated sheets from Arkhet and Munchet of Gorkha. The workers were distributed wages for four and half days.

TAAN President Chandra P rasad Dahal, 1st Vice President Tej Bahadur Gurung, who is also the coordinator of the earthquake relief project, Executive Member Surya Bahadur Ghimire and TAAN

CEO Ganga Sagar Pant were in the team.

In partnership with DDC, TAAN rehabilitated trails, distributed food grains, and corrugated zinc sheets in Tipling, Ri, Lapa, Jharlang, Sertung VDCs of Dhading district as part of the earthquake relief program.

Secretariat Management Coordinator Mukti Pandey Minister for Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation Ananda Prasad Pokharel presented the Letter of Felicitation to Dr Lee. Minister Pokharel also presented Letter of Felicitation, posthumously, to South Korean adventurer Park Young-Seok – the first man in the world to climb all 14 eight-thousanders and Seven Summits, and trek to both poles. He went missing while opening a new climbing route in Mt Annapurna in 2011.

Minister Pokharel presented the Letter of Felicitation to Park's wife. He also presented Token of Love, on behalf of TAAN, to Choe Yong Jin, ambassador of South Korea to Nepal.

Speaking at the program, TAAN General Secretary Karna Bahadur Lama said TAAN's relationship with UAAA began two years ago when TAAN former President Ramesh Dhamala visited UAAA assembly held in Tokyo in 2014. "Last year also, our former president visited UAAA assembly held in Seoul where TAAN was granted 'observer member' status," he added. "Nepal, which lies in the lap of the Himalayas, needs to enhance cooperation with UAAA for effective development and promotion of tourism in mountain areas. UAAA's support is crucial for us in fighting the impacts of climate change and global warming in our country."

Coordinator Shital Chandra Dharel watching is a specialized activity, we are hopeful that the training will enable our trekking guides to handle specialized groups," Lama said. "We will continue to organize different trainings and skills enrichment programs for trekking entrepreneurs and trekking guides in the future as well."

Similarly, Dr Narendra Man Babu Pradhan, CEO of BCN, said BCN was happy to partner with TAAN to impact bird watching skills and techniques on trekking guides. "But training alone won't help bird watching is all about passion," he said. "I am hopeful that the training will be fruitful to you."

Likewise, Shital Chandra Dharel, coordinator of Training & Human Resources Department of TAAN, said TAAN will organize different training programs to enrich professionalism of trekking entrepreneurs as well as workers employed by its member agencies.

The training had sessions on Status and Importance of Nepal's Birds, Eco toursim & Opportunity of Bird Watching Tourism in Nepal, Bird Identification Techniques, Code of Conduct for Bird Watchers, Bird Watching Sites in Nepal and Government Rules & Regulations. Similarly, the participants were also taken on a half-day bird watching trip to Shivapuri forest.

TAAN President Chandra Prasad Rijal handed over certificates to the participants. Addressing the participating trekking guides, Rijal requested the participating trekking guides to implement in practice what they learnt in the training.

TAAN delegation meets Prime Minister Oli

A delegation of Trekking Agencies' Association of Nepal (TAAN) led by President Chandra Prasad Rijal paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister Sharma Oli at the latter's residence in Baluwatar on Thursday.

Office-bearers and executive committee members greeted PM Oli with bouquets, khadas and token of love. On the occasion, President Rijal briefed PM Oli of the activities being carried out by TAAN and its role in the development of adventure tourism in the country.

TAAN also handed over a 24-point memorandum to PM Oli, drawing the latter's



attention toward different problems that Nepali tourism industry, particularly the adventure tourism sector, is facing. Among others, TAAN requested PM Oli to make necessary direction for effective implementation of new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Nepal Tourism Board (NTB) and TAAN for effective implementation of Trekkers' Information Management System (TIMS).

Similarly, it also urged the government to gradually open restricted areas for foreign trekkers so that locals there can get due benefits from tourism. It also requested PM Oli to take necessary initiative for lowering permit fee to Upper Dolpa and Upper Mustang to US\$

Why is TIMS necessary?

- To maintain database of trekkers.
- To trace location of trekkers during emergencies
- To ensure safety and security of trekkers
- To discourage illegal operation of trekking business by unauthorized groups

TAAN Pokhara explores new trail

A team of Trekking Agencies'' Association of Nepal (TAAN) Western Regional Association Pokhara has explored a new trekking trail that starts from Kushma of Parbat and ends at Baskharka of Myagdi district.

A 17-member team led by Narayan Sapkota, former president of TAAN Pokhara, started the exploration with a drive to Kushma from Pokhara. From Kushma, the walk started toward Banau (2150 meters) through Ghumti, Bagaicha, Bhatebari, Dhakdhake and Sidhali.

There is a possibility of promoting home-stay tourism in Banau, according to the exploration team. The village offers magnificent views of Tukuche Peak, Lamjung Himal, Dhaulagiri Range and Annapurna Range.

On the second day, the team reached Falamedanda via Haljur and Taaregaun. The team reached Mohare Danda (3200 meters), which is a fabulous spot to watch sunrise and sunset, on the third day.

Similarly on the fourth day, team walked toward Ramche and Bhirkateri before ending trek at Baskharka.



From Baskharka, jeeps are available to Beni -- the district headquarters of Myagdi. From Myagdi, buses to Buses to Pokhara are available at Baskharka. The team also organized interaction with local stakeholders on different villages along the trail. The discussions centered on tourism potentials in the respective villages and the possibility of developing home-stay facilities there, according to the team.

The trek can be completed in five to seven days, according to the exploration team. Altitude ranges from 820 meters and climbs up to 3,200 meters. One can enjoy see different animal and birds like Blue Sheep, Danfe -- the national bird of Nepal, Munal (pheasants) as well, rhododendron forest, sheep farms and hot springs, among others.

TAAN Pokhara President Ram Chandra Sharma, office-bearers and executive members of TAAN Pokhara, trekking entrepreneurs based in Pokhara as well as media persons were in the team.
